

Artist in the Classroom workshop. The 2015 -2016 RHCPA Education Series promises to deliver more of the same, continuing to guarantee the Total Education Experience.



In this unique half-day program, students will get an all-access Backstage Pass to the Richmond Hill Centre

for students to participate in an Acting 101 workshop taught

by a theatre professional. As well, our knowledgeable technical staff will demonstrate how the stage works, from lighting and sound to curtains and fly lines. The day concludes with a question and answer session, as well as lunch.
