Percy Jackson, Greek Mythology and Edge-of-Your-Seat Action



4 - RHCPA Backstage Pass



n this unique half-day program, students will get an all-access Backstage Pass to the Richmond Hill Centre for the Performing Arts. The morning will begin with an exclusive tour of the theatre, followed by the opportunity for students to participate in an Acting 101 workshop taught by a theatre professional. As well, our knowledgeable

technical staff will demonstrate how the stage works, from lighting and sound to curtains and fly lines. The day concludes with a question and answer session, as well as lunch.
