Final numbers must be confirmed 3 weeks prior to your performance. Final balance is due the day of the performance.

RHCPA has the right to release tickets when contracts and deposits are not received within this time frame. Deposits are non-refundable. No changes to the ticket order will be accepted after the Final Invoice is issued.


